CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS WEEK 22nd-28th January 2024

Cervical Cancer affects women under the age of 45. Almost all cervical cancers are linked to infections with certain types of HPV. If you are 25 years and under and you have missed your HPV vaccine at school at the ages of 12-13 then you may be eligible for the HPV vaccine at the surgery.

Anyone with a cervix can get cervical cancer. When the practice invites you to book your cervical smear with the practice nurse then please don't ignore... book at once! If you have any worries about it our practice nurses are happy to have a chat to ease your mind over the process.
