Are your children up to date with their immunisations?



Childhood Immunisations

Immunisation prepares the body to fight serious infections that might happen in the future. Young babies are very vulnerable to infections, so they need to be protected as early as possible.

Your child needs several different vaccines to be fully protected, so it is important to complete their childhood immunisation programme.

<u>6 to 8 weeks</u>

Your baby will be invited for a thorough physical examination. This is done by Dr Jackson here at the Elms.

Your baby's eyes, heart, hips and – for boys – testicles will be checked. They will also have their weight, length and head circumference measured.

A GP or health visitor will discuss your baby's vaccinations with you. These are offered at 8 weeks, 12 weeks, 16 weeks, and 12 months old, and before your child starts school.

They will also ask you how you have been feeling emotionally and physically since the birth of your baby.

Is your child starting pre-school this September, have they had their vaccinations?

These immunisations will make sure that your child has the best protection against serious childhood

diseases as they grow up.
